Chemical Safety Checklist ①

Prevention of accidental ingestion

Posting of no eating or drinking

Post notices prohibiting eating and drinking.

Prevention of accidents involving outsiders

Posting of no trespassing signs

Post signs prohibiting entry of anyone except related parties.

Prevention of inhalation

Protective gear (in case of emergency)

Prepare dust masks, gas masks, etc. in case of emergency.

Prevention of accidental ingestion

No food or drink

Do not eat or drink in a laboratory.

Prevention of chemical burns and transdermal absorption

Protective gear

Use protective gear (white robe or work clothes, protective glasses, protective gloves, etc.)

Location management

Storage registration

Put a "YAKUMO" barcode sticker on a chemical.



Earthquake countermeasures

Prevention from toppling over

Prevent chemical storage units from toppling over (recommended).

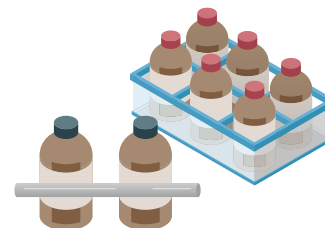
Always secure chemical storage units that have a height of 150 cm or more.

Earthquake countermeasures

Fall prevention

Prevent chemicals from falling (recommended).

Prevent chemicals from falling in the event of an earthquake.



Keeping things sorted and in order

Keeping things in order

Return unused chemicals to their storage locations.

Keeping things in order means keeping necessary items in a predetermined place, in a predetermined quantity, ready for use at any time, and easily accessible.
